


School Times:

BUDGET **5** MEETING

The BUDGET MEETING is held at the end of the 3rd/beginning of the 4th term. The following year's budget is discussed at this meeting and the annual school fees are also confirmed.



Learners may wear civvies to school on their birthday.





CPM ART EXHIBITION: The school offers a cultural evening where learners' art works are displayed and these are sold as a contribution towards school funds.



PRIZEGIVING EVENING: The Gr R learners have a separate prize-giving which provides for many precious moments. Gr 1-3 hold their prize-giving at the end of the year. We are privileged to be able to have every child on the stage to highlight his or her exceptional qualities. For some of the achievements, a small trophy is awarded.

The Gr. 4 – 7 prize-giving is held on a separate evening. Once again, every child is singled out for his or her strong points. The school has an unwritten rule: "Try to catch them doing something right". The focus is on each learner's positive characteristics so as to develop and strengthen their self-image and confidence. Awards are presented for sport, academic achievement, culture and character.



On a TEACHER'S BIRTHDAY each class representative decides whether he/she will hold a small party in the classroom, and contacts the parents about what to bring. It is in no way compulsory to buy a present — you may use your own discretion.

LIBRARY

CPM has a small but energetic library which is visited every week by each class from Gr 1 – Gr 7. The learners may borrow between 1 and 4 books at a time. The library celebrates its birthday at the end of October with a Reading Marathon.

COMPUTER CLASS

Gr R to Gr 7 receive computer training in a venue which was upgraded with the newest computers. The inclusive curriculum, Computers-4-Kids, is followed to ensure that learners receive the best possible training. Gr 6 and 7 do the internationally accredited ICDL (International Computer Driving Licence) computer assessment.



ASSESSMENT

CPM's curriculum is in line with CAPS. Gr 4 – 7, tests are written in the 1st and 3rd terms; during the 2nd and 4th terms, the learners write exams. CPM is also subjected to the WCED systemic tests to ensure that we comply with their requirements. The results of these tests annually indicate that we are achieving above the expected standard.

Requests for a specific teacher:

If you have a valid reason, you may make a written request to have your child placed in a specific teacher's class. This request will be taken into consideration, but we cannot guarantee that we can comply. We would prefer you to trust the judgement of the headmaster and the teachers in this matter. When class division is being decided, we look at friendships, where the child will be happiest, which teacher will best suit him or her and a number of other factors.

If you have a problem concerning the school, or if your child is not happy:



CPM's success is attributed to the fact that the children are really happy at the school and enjoy coming to school. Sometimes, however, it happens that you as parents are dissatisfied with a matter concerning the school, or your child may be unhappy. We believe that, as adults, we can talk things through and come up with solutions together in favour of and for the sake of our children. We therefore recommend that you do not let any unhappiness or grievance continue, but rather follow these steps immediately:



Try to resolve the problem with the teacher (s) concerned by scheduling an appointment as soon as possible and discussing the matter.



If step 1 does not result in a desired response, solution or clarification, the next step is for you and the teacher in question to schedule an appointment with the relevant phase head, and for the 3 parties to try and resolve the matter.

If Step 3 still did not lead to a satisfactory solution to the challenge or grievance, then your next step is to complete a grievance form in full and direct it to the Governing Body. This grievance will then be brought to attention at the next Governing Body meeting, and the Governing Body will work together to come up with a solution to the grievance and communicate with you promptly after the meeting has concluded.





If step 2 was also unable to lead to a satisfactory solution, your third step is to schedule an appointment with the principal, together with the teacher and phase head in question, and to all four work together to find the best satisfactory solution.

The same principles apply to grievances regarding the Principal or a Governing Body member: If you have a complaint regarding the Principal, please first take it up with the Principal himself. If you were unable to resolve the issue, please direct a written complaint to the full Governing Body. If you have any grievance regarding a member of the Governing Body pertaining to school matters, please contact the person directly and try to resolve the matter with him or her. If you could not clarify the matter or complaint, please complete a grievance form, available at the school office and direct it to the full Governing Body. The Governing Body will handle any written complaints at their first meeting after the letter has been received, and they will provide prompt feedback.

If you are convinced that the matter or grievance is extreme and urgent in nature, you are free to take the matter up directly, in writing, with the Principal and Governing Body Chairperson; but the Governing Body is empowered to, at their discretion, ask the person with the grievance to still follow steps 1 to 4 in order to try and find a suitable solution.

It is very important to us that everyone is happy at school, and that you are satisfied and confident about your child's education and general well-being.
